

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 2:00pm. Commissioners Imperiale and Rice were present.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor stated to the best of his knowledge all the requirements of the Sunshine Law have been met. Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on December 9, 2021 in the Asbury Park Press and on December 16, 2021 in the Beach Haven Times, and republished with amendments on February 24, 2022 and March 8, 2022 respectively. The time change for this meeting was published in the Asbury Park Press on September 22, 2022 and in the Beach Haven Times on September 29, 2022, and posted on the website on October 4, 2022.

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on September 19, 2022 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

The Mayor introduced Bob Schuster, Bureau Chief from NJDEP Marine Water Monitoring; he was invited to give an explanation of the recent peanut bunker fish kills in Kinsey and Harvest Coves. Mr. Schuster distributed a printed slideshow to the Board and public, a copy of which is attached. He introduced himself stating he worked with the LBI Health Department over the summer regarding the fish kills; he has a great deal of water monitoring experience and has seen many similar fish kills throughout the State. He asked everyone to follow along with the paper slideshow which included graphs and charts of water and air temperature history. He explained how important oxygen levels are to the fish and what factors contribute to low oxygen levels such as the water and air temperatures, water flow and flushing of the bay and coves; and algae growth. He explained the bunker fish are very sensitive to low oxygen, especially the smaller bunker. The public and Board asked questions and discussed what can and cannot be done in the future. Most of the public questions regarded health concerns that will be addressed with the Health Department at a future meeting. The discussion concluded with the Board stating they will come up with a clean-up plan for the future, including researching for equipment such as a "vac truck".

The Mayor read the following ordinance by title and number and stated that proof of publication is on hand and the ordinance has been posted.

COMMISSIONER REPORTS

Mayor Oldham summarized a letter received from CRS Coordinator Michelle Homberg. A copy of the letter is attached and available for viewing in the office of the Municipal Clerk. The letter reports updates of Harvey Cedars projects for the Ocean County Multi-Jurisdictional Plan and CRS rating (flood insurance); it lists completed and ongoing projects, including the purchase of a generator and elevation of control panels at the 80th Street Water Plant, and the beach replenishment project.

The Mayor stated the beach has taken a tremendous hit (recent storm) however nothing what Florida is experiencing (Hurricane Ian). The Mayor stated he is working on getting the Federal renourishment project for 2023; Public Works is working on fixing the access to the beach. He stated dune grass planting will be tomorrow with the Taxpayers Association.

Commissioner Imperiale thanked the Police Officers for their recent Police Forum, and stated the next forum is October 26th at 5:00pm with Detective Butler to talk about investigations, scams and crime prevention.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR –

Walt Naisby, East 82nd Street, asked if the 72nd and 85th Street project included curbs, he is interested in having curbing on his street. The Mayor stated that project is already done and curbs were added to oceanside streets because of the water and sand runoff, and also to encourage parking spaces.

Kathy Ries, Taxpayers Association, stated 92 bricks and 15 mini-bricks have been ordered to date; she stated a holiday mini-brick campaign could be advertised via email with a deadline to have the mini-bricks by the holidays. The Board agreed to coordinate the emails, and Ms. Ries stated she will email the text.

Sandy Freeman, West 84th Street, addressed the 4-foot distance law with cars and bikers, and described an occurrence on the Boulevard with bikers; she stated she wished the bikers would obey the traffic lights. Commissioner Imperiale stated there have been tickets recently issued to bikers that have ignored the lights; he stated the law does need some more public awareness.

Kathy Ries stated the Taxpayers Association did a survey on the construction noise ordinance and asked if there is a forward motion on the ordinance. Mayor Oldham said he read a lot of the survey comments, and more than just the time will need to be addressed such as issues of job management, radio usage, and parking. He stated a suggestion was made by Arlene Schragger about coordinating the construction hours with Daylight Savings Time shifts, however there are many other factors that bothered people. The Board and public discussed construction projects and their issues.

INSURANCE FUND FOR DENTAL BENEFITS**

WHEREAS a number of public entities in the State of New Jersey have joined together to form the Central Jersey Health Insurance Fund, hereafter referred to as “the FUND”, as permitted by NJAC 11:15-3, NJSA 17:1-8.1 and NJSA 40A:10-36 et seq.; and

WHEREAS the FUND was approved to become operational by the Departments of Insurance and Community Affairs and has been operational since that date; and

WHEREAS the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a joint health insurance fund contain certain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such the FUND; and

WHEREAS the governing body of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, hereinafter referred to as “LOCAL UNIT” has determined that membership in the FUND is in the best interest of the LOCAL UNIT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars hereby agrees as follows:

- i. To renew membership with the FUND for the period outlined in the LOCAL UNIT’s Indemnity and Trust Agreement.
- ii. To participate in the Dental Insurance as defined pursuant to NJSA 17B:17-4, the FUND’s Bylaws, and Plan of Risk Management.
- iii. To adopt and approve the FUND’s Bylaws.
- iv. To execute an application for membership and any accompanying certifications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the governing body of the LOCAL UNIT is authorized and directed to execute the Indemnity and Trust Agreement and such other documents signifying membership in the FUND as required by the FUND’s Bylaws, and to deliver these documents to the FUND’s Executive Director with the express reservation that these documents shall become effective only upon:

- i. Approval of the LOCAL UNIT by the FUND.
- ii. Receipt from the LOCAL UNIT of a Resolution accepting assessment.
- iii. Approval by the New Jersey Department of Insurance and Department of Community Affairs.

WHEREAS the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation, awarded a road reconstruction/improvement grant to the Borough of Harvey Cedars; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars opened sealed bids for the 2020 Road Reconstruction/Improvement Project on August 25, 2021; and

WHEREAS on September 3, 2021, Earle Asphalt Company, the lowest bidder, was awarded the bid in the amount of \$205,813.13; and

WHEREAS the engineer has determined that lower quantities of certain bid items were required (\$20,040.28) and additional quantities of other bid items were needed (\$9,180.45) and the Department of Transportation has approved these items.

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars is enrolled in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) to provide flood insurance for the residents of Harvey Cedars; and

WHEREAS the NFIP provides for insurance premium discounts for communities that voluntarily take part in the Community Rating System (CRS) program that is a component of the NFIP; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars takes part in the Community Rating System and presently holds a Class 8 Rating, which the Borough's Office of Emergency Management (OEM) strives to maintain or possibly improve; and

WHEREAS the Borough disseminates flood hazard information that not only is beneficial to the residents through mitigation of the hazardous effects of flooding, but is also beneficial in maximizing credit in the CRS program by conforming to the Program for Public Information standard outlined in the 2017 CRS Coordinator's Manual; and

WHEREAS all the other municipalities on Long Beach Island also participate in the CRS program and are trying to maintain their flood insurance discounts for their residents; and

WHEREAS a Multijurisdictional Program for Public Information was formulated including all six municipalities on Long Beach Island to deliver consistent outreach messages to all island residents; and

WHEREAS the OEM has determined that it was necessary to create a Program for Public Information (PPI) in order to maintain the present Class 8 Rating; and

WHEREAS the OEM recommends the Borough of Harvey Cedars approve the Program for Public Information Amendment; and

As a requirement of CRS participation guidelines, I am providing an update of Harvey Cedars action items as outlined in the 2014 Ocean County Multi-Jurisdictional Plan update in 2018.

Completed projects are as follows;

- Action 6-4.11-2: Purchase and installation of a permanent generator for the water plant on 80th Street
- Action 6-4.11-3: Elevating the electrical control and panels at the 80th Street Water Plant: A borough letter to the Office of Emergency Management confirming completion of generator and electrical panel projects cost share figures were submitted on October 10, 2018.
- Action 6-4.11-10: USACE Replenishment project and dune restoration; Allow for construction of the large dune from Manasquan to Barnegat Light: Completion date: 10/15/18, final inspection 10/22/18. Sub-Grantee Closeout Report signed 2/25/19

Ongoing Projects as outlined in the Ocean County Multi-Jurisdictional Plan;

- Action 6.4.11-4: Dune grass planting in the fall
- Action 6.4.11-11: Continued participation in and increasing level of CRS Program: We're currently a Class 8, with a possible increased in level following our 5-year CRS review in April 2019. A determination on a possible class 7 rating for Harvey Cedars is pending the assessment of Community Assisted Visits (CAV). Class 8 provides a 10 % discount on federally backed mortgages for all properties in the SFHA, which encompasses all of Harvey Cedars.

Action 6.4.11-14: Outreach to borough residents and the Taxpayers Association at events, such as summer concerts: Harvey Cedars participates in the island-wide Long Beach Island Program for Public Information that coordinates public stakeholder outreaches at various locations.


Notifications of the events are published in “The Sandpaper”, a local news publication, as well as the borough website and social media. Information is also disseminated at craft shows and concerts.
