Beach Replenishment Project to Start

Thanks to Congressman Saxton, Harvey Cedars has the opportunity to benefit from a preliminary start to the \$50 million LBI shore protection project. While this initial phase will be trucked, not pumped, it will bolster some otherwise weak dune areas in town, Salem Ave. south to Cumberland. The federal, state and county funding for this phase will come from the larger, future project, and we expect the trucks to commence rolling September 30, 2005. The sand will be white.

The major project is slated to begin in 2006 with the dredged pumping of sand. The Borough will be contacting a number of oceanfront homeowners to obtain north/south easements across their beach property.

Water Main Project to Start

23 streets (listed below) will have their substandard water mains replaced with new 6" lines. Existing laterals to individual properties will be reconnected to new mains if they are copper, or they will be replaced and reconnected if they are galvanized. Your meter pit must be accessible. Landscaping or paving that covers the meter pit will be removed and must be replaced or repaired by homeowners at his/her own expense. The project will begin in September at the north end of town with all mains being replaced in the fall. Final repaving will be done in the spring after settlement of the trenches.
