#### TOPICS OF INTEREST / COMMISSIONER REPORTS –

Commissioner Rice stated that work on the budget for 2024 has started. "The process usually takes a few months to complete", stated Rice.

Commissioner Gieger stated that his focus at this time is work going on for the Streetscape Project. "The project is moving along nicely, work by Black Eyed Susans should start as early as next week and then work on the east side of the boulevard should start soon", stated Gieger.

Mayor Imperiale mentioned that a meeting took place with the Army Corp of Engineers and the DEP to talk about this year's Beach Replenishment Project. Imperiale thanked Past Mayor Oldham for joining the meeting to help with a smooth transition. "We will be getting the replenishment this year, we hope that it won't take place during the summer months, but we do not have the luxury of turning the project away if it is scheduled during the summer months", stated Imperiale. The mayor thanked Commissioner Rice for all of his work so far on necessary funding of the project. The mayor also thanked Commissioner Gieger for working out the logistics of staging for equipment needed for the project.

Mayor Imperiale stated that he and Chief Burnaford met with Ocean County Engineers to discuss safety on the boulevard after the December 1<sup>st</sup> fatal accident on 80<sup>th</sup> Street. The discussion was mainly about safety issues related to traffics lights, speed limits, and other measures needed to make sure everything is being done to make the area safe for pedestrians. A safety study will be done by the Ocean County Engineers to determine if new safety measures should be implemented.

#### PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz, 82<sup>nd</sup> Street asked about the sale of the Essex Lot and how the money from the sale of the lot will be used. Fritz also asked if there was a financial plan in place if the Volunteer Fire Company had to go to a paid fire company, and that financial burden fell on the town.

Mayor Imperiale explained that the sale of Essex lot will provide the town with enough money in saved assets to be eligible for matching grants. Grant funding would hopefully provide us with enough money to make much needed improvements in Sunset Park. Imperiale stated a lot of money is needed for improvements in Sunset Park for needed work on landscaping, renovation to park bathrooms, exercise equipment, and just overall beautification of the park. The asset money from the sale of Essex lot will allow us the opportunity to tap into much needed grant funding stated Imperiale.

Commissioner Gieger also discussed future improvements in the park. Some of the new features would include the ability to either turn down lighting at night, or to turn off park lighting completely at night to eliminate some light pollution for the neighbors. Gieger stated that we really need to get Green Acres Funding money in order to make all of the needed improvements in the park.

Fred Schragger, East Salem discussed the need for irrigation for plantings installed in 2023. Fred and Arlene Schragger, along with a volunteer committee, have put in a lot of plantings and maintenance into landscaping last season. The landscaping needs to be watered if it is to survive. Funding for the irrigation system will need to be worked into the budget said Schragger.

Walt Naisby, 82<sup>nd</sup> Street asked what datum the Corp of Engineer will use to determine how much fill will be required for the upcoming replenishment. Naisby also asked if the plan was to fill the beach up to the minimum or to go higher than the minimum. Mayor Imperiale stated that the Corp uses a calculation to determine the fill minimum to last at least 7 years, enough sand to last until the next scheduled replenishment project.

Commissioner Rice pointed out that Harvey Cedars is being treated as a priority for the Replenishment Project due to our need. The area where sand will be coming has been established, we will be receiving more than half of the overall sand dedicated for the entire island just in Harvey Cedars.

Fred Schragger asked why street end barriers were removed at the beach street ends. Gieger explained that the barriers were in major disrepair and needed mending. Schragger requested the barriers be repaired and replaced on his street stating they are really needed there according to him and others on Salem Ave.

Art Ballinger, 77<sup>th</sup> Street thanked the commissioners for adopting changes to current LOSAP system. Ballinger stated that the change will make it much more equitable for our volunteer fire fighters. Ballinger also inquired about the sale of the Essex Lot, asking if the property was an Open Space Lot. Mayor Imperiale stated that the Essex Lot was not designated as Open Space which makes it available for sale. Imperiale added that the lot, if sold, will alleviate the need for Public Works to maintain the lot. The lot would be more profitable to us if it was owned privately and we were able to collect money from it through taxation.

Ballinger asked about doggie bag dispensers (Mutt Mitts), stating that he understands that some dispensers have been removed completely around town. Ballinger requests the dispensers are returned and filled for dog owner to use. Commissioner Gieger addressed the concern stating he will look into the matter. "We do have an issue; people are taking all of the bags out and emptying the dispensers at an unbelievable rate since the plastic bag ban", stated Gieger

Mr. & Mrs. Whalen, Bergen Ave. appeared to address concerns regarding low water pressure and sediment in their water since the watermain replacement on Bergen Ave. Mr. Whalen requested that the town check the pressure on Bergen Ave. Commissioner Gieger stated that he would have issue addressed. Mr. Whalen also commented that the water tower looks great since its last cleaning.

Fred Schragger for the School Board, stated that the School Board has finally agreed to consolidate the two schools into one. The project has been scaled down to a much more reasonable project. Schragger stated that he was relieved that there was finally an agreement. Schragger said "kids will not be relocated from the LBI School prior to September of 2026, at the earliest".

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975 ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION" AS IT PERTAINS TO THE EMERGENCY SERVICES VOLUNTEER LENGTH OF SERVICE AWARDS PROGRAM (LOSAP) SCHEDULE A

(High Point Volunteer Fire Company)

WHEREAS, the Borough of Harvey Cedars deems it appropriate and necessary to act to amend the LOSAP Fire Call Response Point System provided in (Schedule A) of the existing ordinance to ensure retention of members and to provide incentives for recruiting volunteer firefighters.

### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, as follows:

Subsection 2-12.10(c) entitled "Length of Service Awards Program (LOSAP) for Firefighters", is hereby amended by amending and supplementing paragraph 2 of Attachment 1:1, (SCHEDULE A) High Point Volunteer Fire Company Length of Service Award Program (Section 2-12.10), Fire Call Responses to read as follows:

#### Fire Call Responses

60% or greater = 20 points 50% to 59% = 16 points 40% to 49% = 13 points 30% to 39% = 10 points 20% to 29% = 7 points 16% to 19% = 5 points 11% to 15% = 4 points 6% to 10% = 3 points 1% to 5% = 2 points

- Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.
