The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:30pm. Commissioners Imperiale and Rice were present along with Borough Attorney, Michael McKenna.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor stated to the best of his knowledge all the requirements of the Sunshine Law have been met. Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on December 22, 2022 in the Asbury Park Press and on December 29, 2022 in the Beach Haven Times.

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on March 3, 2023 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

Motion to open public discussion: Commissioner Imperiale Second: Commissioner Rice

Joe Gieger, East 77th Street asked for an explanation as to why the Commissioners aren't amending the ordinance to a start time of 8am for year-round, citing a disadvantage to year-round residents.

Commissioner Imperiale explained that while he would have liked to see a no construction before 8am start time year-round, he is glad that this ordinance will provide a compromise at this time. Some residents will be able to benefit this year if the ordinance is adopted as proposed. Commissioner Imperiale stated that he will continue to push for an 8am year-round start time for construction noise as more residents live in Harvey Cedars year-round.

Commissioner Rice stated there is also an obligation to contractors who are Harvey Cedars residents. Construction is their business, and we have to be supportive of all businesses within Harvey Cedars. We have at least five contractors who owns construction businesses and are residents of the Borough. We need to think about how these changes will affect their businesses, construction completion times, and ultimately the costs associated with only being permitted to work shorter days.

Mayor Oldham cited the real issue not only being noise but the way the jobs are being managed by contractors, not all job sites are the same. Many of the issues brought up by residents are regarding the condition and cleanliness of construction sites. Not all complaints from neighbors are about noise. Some contractors are more respectful than others of neighbors during construction. Loud music and messy job sites are a nuisance to neighbors at any hour of the day.

Kathy Ries questioned as to how the Borough will disseminate information to contractors so they will be aware of the new regulation and changes for permitted hours of construction. Mayor Oldham explained that the Harvey Cedars Building Department provides important information such as local ordinance notices to contractors at the time they submit for any construction work. The new regulations will be available to contractors at the time they submit for new permits.

Jim Fritz, 82nd Street asked how the ordinance and new times of construction compare with other towns on the island, citing that he's heard Harvey Cedars is hard to do business in. Mayor Oldham replied that a comparison has been done. Most island

towns permit construction to start at 7am where we will be requiring no earlier than 8am for a majority of the year. Construction will not be permitted on Sundays unless it's for emergency work or minor work not requiring a permit. This change will help close the loop-hole we have seen in recent years where contractors who own the property and took advantage of building on Sundays.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz representing the Taxpayers Association, reported that after review of the proposed budget, no unreasonable items were found listed. A recent survey by the Taxpayers Association showed that tax payers do not want to compromise on services being offered by the borough. They agree with the proposed necessary rate increase, but would like to see cuts where possible in the future.

Mayor Oldham asked if the Taxpayers Association had suggestions regarding areas where changes and cuts could be made to cut expenses that would not result in services being provided being cut. A discussion between Jim Fritz, other residents present, and commissioners continued with mention of trash services and other areas where cost cutting measures could be taken. Mayor Oldham stated he will reach out to adjoining island towns to see if there are any other ideas or possibilities to save on costs through shared services or mutual agreements.

Margaret "Pooch" Buchholz, asked if the County would be fixing the bullhead at the end of 80th street. The bulkhead at the end of 80th street is on a county road and is in disrepair. Mayor Oldham stated that the County said projects are planned in the near future including the bulkhead.

Commissioner Imperiale mentioned Casino Night, hosted by the Harvey Cedars Police Foundation at the High Point Fire Company on Saturday, April 22nd. Proceeds will benefit the foundation, Fire Company, and will allow for the ability to issue scholarships through the foundation to deserving students. Commissioner Imperiale encouraged everyone to come out and join in the fun for a good cause.

Commissioner Rice acknowledged all of the departments within the borough for their work on the budget process, stating it was difficult to keep costs down with inflation and other factors. Over \$500,000.00 (Five-hundred thousand dollars) in cuts was made by the departments in an effort not to raise taxes before the budget was adopted. Commissioner Rice also encouraged everyone to purchase Harvey Cedars activity wear as a way to support the Activity Committee. Mayor Oldham gave an update on progress in obtaining signed easement agreements for the Streetscape Project. The project is set to start in the Fall. We're looking to go out to bid sometime in the Spring.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPALITY IN PREPARING ITS 2023 BUDGET TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS the Local Government Cap Law, NJSA 40A:4-45.1 et. seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS NJSA 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized herein that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Harvey Cedars shall, in accordance with this ordinance and NJSA 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$137,371.64 and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Borough of Harvey Cedars be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO VARIOUS ROADS LOCATED IN THE BOROUGH AND APPROPRIATING \$600,000 THEREFORE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$300,000 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS TO FINANCE THE SAME

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), DOES ORDAIN, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Harvey Cedars, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"), as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$600,000 including \$418,540 in Transportation Trust Fund Grants expected to be received through the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation's Fiscal Year 2023 Municipal Aid. No down payment is required in connection with the authorization of bonds and notes pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) as this bond ordinance involves a project to be funded by a State grant.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not otherwise provided for hereunder, negotiable bonds or notes are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$300,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued is for the improvement of West Bergen Ave and West 75th Street located in the Borough, and including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget or temporary capital budget (as applicable) of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget or amended temporary capital budget (as applicable) and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

 (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. No part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$300,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An amount not exceeding \$120,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvement or purpose.

Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the

obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough is hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

<u>Section 9</u>. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

Section 10. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

 - a. Monday through Friday before the hours of 7:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. between November and February, and before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. between March and October.
 - b. Saturday before 9:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M, year-round
 - c. Sundays
- <u>Section 2</u>. Section 12-9.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Days and Hours", paragraphs a, b and c are hereby repealed and readopted as follows:
 - a. Monday through Friday:
 - 1. (November through February) beginning no earlier than 7:00 A.M. and ending no later than 6:00 P.M.
 - 2. (March through October) beginning no earlier than 8:00 A.M. and ending no later than 6:00 P.M.
 - b. Saturdays, beginning no earlier than 9:00 A.M. and ending no later than 6:00 P.M, year-round.
 - c. Sunday No construction work shall be permitted.
- <u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- <u>Section 4</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.
