Margaret Thomas Buchholz "Pooch", was recognized on April 15<sup>th</sup> during her 90<sup>th</sup> birthday party at High Point Fire Company. A proclamation by the Board of Commissioners was presented to Pooch and read out loud to all who were present. The proclamation as presented is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Commissioner Imperiale announced that Casino Night, sponsored by the Harvey Cedars Police Foundation is scheduled for the upcoming weekend. Proceeds will benefit the High Point Fire Company and the Harvey Cedars Police Foundation. Commissioner Imperiale invited the residents to take part in the event. Other events in the near future include a Harvey Cedars Beach Patrol forum on May 25<sup>th</sup>, where Lifeguard Chief, Randy Townsend will be the speaker. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Fred Bercari, West 82<sup>nd</sup> street asked that street ends, specifically areas with benches down by the bulkheads, which are intended for public use be regularly maintained by public works. "Vegetation and weeds are often so overgrown around the benches that these areas become impossible to use", stated Bercari. Mayor Oldham thanked Mr. Bercari for bringing the issue to light. The mayor assured Mr. Bercari that he would look into the situation.

Sandy Freeman, West 84<sup>th</sup> Street stated that the public bench at the end of 84<sup>th</sup> Street is regularly moved by bulkheading contractors when they use the street end to unload materials. Sandy asked if something could be done to control the situation.

Kathy Ries, Cedars Ave. resident and President of the Taxpayers Association, announced that registration forms are now available for the annual HCTA Town Wide Yard Sale. The forms can be found on the HCTA website. The yard sale will take place on May 27<sup>th</sup>. Kathy also reported that 199 bricks have been sold to date and suggested QR code advertisements as a way to promote brick sales for the Sunset Park Project.

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED "BUILDING AND HOUSING" AS IT PERTAINS TO THE USE OF GENERATORS AND COMPRESSORS FOR CONSTRUCTION SITES

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS**, as follows:

Section 1. Section 12-11 entitled "Use of Generators Prohibited" is hereby amended to read as follows:

12-11 USE OF GENERATORS AND COMPRESSORS PROHIBITED.

12-11.1 Power Generators and Compressors. Gas-powered electric generators and gas-powered air compressors shall be prohibited on construction sites or during any construction project. If electric service is not available on site, a temporary electric power pole shall be installed and activated for electric power.

12-11.2 Exceptions. Exceptions may be made in case of urgent necessity in the interest of public health and safety with prior approval from the Construction Official.

- <u>Section 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- <u>Section 3</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- <u>Section 4</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 21 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS ENTITLED "PROPERTY MAINTENANCE" AS IT PERTAINS TO DEFINITIONS AND REGULATIONS OF LEAD-BASED PAINT INSPECTIONS

**WHEREAS,** pursuant to P.L. 2021, c.182, all municipalities are required to inspect every single-family, two-family, and multiple rental properties on a recurring basis and at tenant turnover for lead-based paint hazards; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the State's mandate, the Commissioners of Harvey Cedars have adopted the regulations set forth herein.

**THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 21-4 entitled "Definitions" is hereby amended by supplementing the following definitions in alphabetical order:

LEAD ABATEMENT – measures designed to permanently eliminate lead-based paint hazards in accordance with standards established by the Commissioner of Community Affairs in compliance with promulgated by the appropriate federal agencies.

LEAD EVALUATION CONTRACTOR – A person certified by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs to perform lead inspection and risk assessment work pursuant N.J.A.C. 5:171.1 et seq.

LEAD-BASED HAZARD – Any condition that causes exposure to lead from leadcontaminated dust or soil or lead-contaminated paint that is deteriorated or present in surfaces that would result in adverse human health effects.

TENANT TURNOVER – The time at which all existing occupants vacate a dwelling unit and all new tenants move into the dwelling unit.

Section 2. Chapter 21 entitled "Property Maintenance" is hereby amended by inserting Section 12 entitled "Lead-Based Paint Inspections" as follows:

#### 21-12 Lead-Based Paint Inspections.

- a. The owner of every single-family, two-family, and/or multiple dwelling unit offered for rent shall be required to secure an inspection by the Borough or hire a lead evaluation contractor to perform the inspection of the unit for lead-based paint hazards in accordance with the requirements of this Chapter within two years of the effective date of the law, July 2, 2022, or at tenant turnover, whichever is earlier.
- b. In lieu of having the dwelling inspected by the Borough's lead evaluator, a dwelling owner or landlord may directly hire a private lead evaluation contractor who is certified to provide lead paint inspection services by the Department of Community Affairs to perform the lead-based paint inspection in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.1 et seq.
- c. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(c), a dwelling unit in a singlefamily, two-family, or multiple rental dwelling shall not be subject to inspection and evaluation for the presence of lead-based paint hazards if the unit:

(1) Has been certified to be free of lead-based paint;

(2) Was constructed during or after 1978;

(3) Is in a multiple dwelling that has been registered with the Department of Community Affairs as a multiple dwelling for at least ten (10) years, either under the current or a previous owner, and has no outstanding lead violations from the most recent cyclical inspection performed on the multiple dwelling under the "Hotel and Multiple Dwelling Law," P.L.1967, c.76 (C.55:13A-1 et seq.);

(4) Is a single-family or two-family seasonal rental dwelling which is rented for less than six months duration each year by tenants that do not have consecutive lease renewals; or

(5) Has a valid lead-safe certification.

- d. The owner, landlord, and/or agent of every single-family, two-family, or multiple rental dwelling unit offered for rental shall be required to obtain an inspection of the unit for lead-based paint hazards every three (3) years, or at tenant turnover, whichever is earlier.
- e. If lead-based paint hazards are identified, then the owner, landlord, and/or agent of the dwelling shall remediate the lead-based paint hazard using lead abatement or lead-based control methods in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(d). Upon the remediation of the lead-based paint hazard, the Borough's lead evaluation contractor shall conduct an additional inspection of the unit to certify that the hazard no longer exists.
- f. If no lead-based paint hazards are identified, then the Borough's lead evaluator shall certify the dwelling as lead-safe on a form prescribed by the Department of Community Affairs, which shall be valid for two (2) years.
- g. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(e), property owners shall:

(1) Provide evidence of valid lead-safe certification and the most recent tenant turnover at the time of the cyclical inspection

(2) Provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification obtained pursuant to this Section to new tenants of the property at the time of tenant turnover unless not required to have had an inspection by a lead evaluation contractor or permanent local agency.

(3) Maintain records of lead-safe certification, which shall include name(s) of the unit tenant(s), if inspection was conducted during a period of tenancy.

#### 21-12.1 Fees.

The fee shall be equal to the amount incurred by the Borough for the third-party lead inspection services for each unit lead-based paint inspection. An owner may also directly hire a private lead evaluation contractor pursuant to lead inspection requirements in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16(h). An additional fee of \$20.00 per dwelling unit inspected is due whether or not the inspection is performed by a private lead evaluation contractor or the Borough for the purpose of the "Lead Hazard Control Assistance Act" (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.7, et seq.) concerning lead hazard control work, unless the unit owner demonstrates that the Department of Community Affairs has already assessed an additional inspection fee of \$20 pursuant to the provisions of section 10 of P.L.2330, c.311 (N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.4)

#### 21-12.2 Violations and Penalties.

- a. If a property owner has failed to conduct the required inspection or initiate any remediation as required by N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.1 et seq. the owner shall have 30 days to cure the violation.
- b. If a property owner fails to cure the violation after 30 days, the property owner shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed \$1,000.00 per week until the required inspection has been conducted or remediation efforts have been initiated.
- <u>Section 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

- **Section 3.** If any word, phrase, clause, section or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

**WHEREAS** the Local Government Cap Law, NJSA 40A:4-45.1 et. seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS NJSA 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

**WHEREAS** the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

**WHEREAS** the Board of Commissioners hereby determines that any amount authorized herein that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars in the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Harvey Cedars shall, in accordance with this ordinance and NJSA 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$137,371.64 and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Borough of Harvey Cedars be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and
