A motion was made by Commissioner Rice, seconded by Commissioner Imperiale, to approve the request to use the municipal bay beach parking lot for overflow storage of sailboats overnight to the Barnegat Light Yacht on June 25th & 26th, 2022. Barricades requested from Public Works and possible off-duty police.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

The Deputy Mayor explained the purpose and evolution of the Three-Person Site Plan Committee ordinance (that was tabled at this meeting); the purpose was if a business wanted a non-substantial change they could simply apply to the Three-Person Committee for a lesser fee instead of going through the lengthy time process of the Land Use Board for thousands of dollars; he said the Commissioners discussed at length all aspects of the ordinance, such as who would be the Committee members, and finally came up with the ordinance that was introduced at the previous meeting; since then there has been feedback that led to tabling the ordinance in order to hear public opinions. He asked how does the Board create a 3-person committee that is effective for this town, and is there a way to approve simple changes for a local business without going through the Land Use Board. Commissioner Rice stated it would be nice to always say "yes" but unfortunately there are State laws that must be followed; to make a permanent change for a business, neighbors must be notified, this (tabled) ordinance was only for off-season changes.

A public discussion was held regarding how a business can legally fast-track a de minimis change. Fred Schragger stated he has been a municipal attorney for many years and has dealt with Land Use; he offered his input to help come up with a legal solution. The Board will be setting up a meeting soon to work on this and invited Mr. Schragger to join.

Margaret "Pooch" Buchholz, Bay Terrace, asked about the town acquiring the 1906 house on Lee Avenue; it is 800 square feet and could either be used as lifeguard housing or somewhere in the park. Commissioner Imperiale stated the Board is considering it, and will need to work out the details of where it would go.

Commissioner Imperiale thanked everyone for their feedback.
