#### POLICE AWARDS PRESENTATION -

Chief Burnaford stated typically officers are honored annually in person, however due to the pandemic, officers will be formally presented their awards at a later date. He announced the following awards:

- 1. <u>Officer Ben Mrozinski</u>: who will be the new traffic safety officer, has been recognized and received an award from *Mothers Against Drunk Driving* for his outstanding work when it comes to addressing intoxicated drivers. In 2020, Officer Mrozinski had 5 DUI arrests, 83% of the DUI arrests.
- 2. <u>Detective Tim Butler</u>: *Certificate of Merit* Detective Butler is being recognized for ensuring that the Police Department achieved its 3<sup>rd</sup> Re-Accreditation. The time and energy spent making sure that all aspects of the agency's operations are compliant has not gone unnoticed. From report writing, to reorganizing the evidence room, to equipment maintenance, to training, Detective Butler made sure the Department was more than prepared.
- 3. <u>Detective Chris Oldham</u>: Certificate of Life Saving On September 15, 2018, Detective Oldham was dispatched to the East 86<sup>th</sup> Street Beach for a reported swimmer in distress. When Detective Oldham arrived on scene, he observed what appeared to be a male caught in a rip current. Without hesitation, Detective Oldham entered the water, along with the Captain of the Barnegat Life First Aid Squad and a bystander, made contact with the victim, and safely brought him to shore. Due to the quick actions of Detective Oldham, the victim refused any additional medical treatment. Detective Oldham clearly went above and beyond the call of duty and is hereby commended for his actions.
- 4. Officer Nick D'Andrea: Certificate of Life Saving On March 13, 2021, Officer D'Andrea responded to a first aid call in North Beach. Upon his arrival, he observed the patient to be unconscious and not breathing. Officer D'Andrea, who was the first Officer on scene, immediately began CPR. Shortly after completing his two rounds of chest compressions, the Long Beach Township Officers, now on scene, were able to find a pulse. The patient was transported by ambulance to the hospital for further medical treatment. Due to the quick actions of Officer D'Andrea, he was able to save this person's life. Officer D'Andrea is hereby commended for his actions.
- 5. <u>ALL OFFICERS</u> ~ the *COVID-19 Responder Citation* is presented to every Officer in the Department. Throughout the pandemic, Harvey Cedars officers never missed a beat and never complained; there is no playbook on how to handle and respond to a pandemic.

- 6. <u>OFFICER OF THE YEAR</u>: Besides patrolling, this year's Officer of the Year recipient's current responsibilities include:
  - Assistant Firearms Instructor
  - Overseeing the ordering of uniforms
  - Overseeing the Vehicle Maintenance program
  - Coordinating with Public Works and vehicle companies to address and follow through with vehicle issues.
  - Handles ordering and ensures all of the equipment within the vehicles are operational; if not, works with the various providers to address the problems.

This year's recipient is meticulous in every aspect of his job; he has had multiple positive encounters with the public, he takes initiative, he wants to help where ever he can; you give him a task, you know it will get done; and he does not ask or want the credit. This Officer continues to be an example for all others to follow. He lives up to the department's motto "Commitment to Excellence". Chief Burnaford thanked him for his professionalism and his commitment to this town and Department and announced this year's Officer of the Year is Officer Daniel Grundtisch.

The Board thanked the Chief and congratulated the Department.

- Section 1. The definition entitled *Building Footprint Area* of Section 13-3 of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Definitions", is hereby amended and supplemented by adding the words "or generator" after the words "air conditioner" in the first bullet of the definition.
- Section 2. Section 13-15.1 of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "General Provisions" is hereby amended by repealing paragraph a in its entirety, and realphabetizing paragraph b as paragraph a, and paragraph c as paragraph b.
- Section 3. Section 13-15.2 of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Fence Permit" is hereby amended by supplementing the following paragraph:
  - e. Existing lots of record which adjoin filled lots, as per Section 12-8.11 entitled "Lot Elevation", may erect a fence to a height not to exceed that of the adjoining filled lot fence. This shall only apply to fences along the property lines which abut the filled lot, as per Section 12-8.11, until such a time that elevations are matched and fences will be lowered to meet the four-foot (4') height requirement.
- <u>Section 4</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS as follows:

Section 1. Section 3-2.7 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Noise Prohibited" is hereby supplemented and amended to add the following to the paragraph:

No person shall operate or permit the operation of any leaf blower, lawn mower, saw, drill, sander, grinder, or similar devises outdoors Mondays through Fridays before the hours of 7:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. after Labor Day through Memorial Day, or before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. from Memorial Day through Labor Day; or on any Saturday or Sunday before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. This coincides with the permissible hours of construction.

No person shall operate or permit the operation of any leaf blower, lawn mower, saw, drill, sander, grinder, or similar devices outdoors as follows:

- 1. Mondays through Thursdays before the hours of 7:00 A.M. and after 7:00 P.M. after Labor Day through Memorial Day, or before 8:00 A.M. and after 7:00 P.M. from Memorial Day through Labor Day;
- 2. Fridays before the hours of 7:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. after Labor Day through Memorial Day, or before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M. from Memorial Day through Labor Day;
- 3. Any Saturday or Sunday before 8:00 A.M. and after 6:00 P.M.
- Section 2. Section 12-9.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Hours of Construction" is hereby amended by inserting in the first sentence after the first 4 words, the words "whether performed by a contractor, business owner or homeowner".
- Section 3. Section 12-9.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Days and Hours" paragraph b. "Saturdays", subparagraph 2 is hereby amended as follows:
  - 2. From Memorial Day through Labor Day beginning no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and ending no later than 2:00 p.m., except by the homeowner ending no later than 6 p.m.
- Section 4. Section 12-9.1 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Days and Hours" paragraph c is hereby amended as follows:
  - c. No construction activity shall be performed on Sundays, except by the homeowner beginning no earlier than 9:00 a.m. and ending no later than 6:00 p.m.
- <u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN AND THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS FOR FIRE INSPECTION SERVICES

**WHEREAS** the Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A: 65-1 et seq., authorizes the Borough of Harvey Cedars to enter into a contract for the provision of certain governmental services with the County of Ocean; and

WHEREAS N.J.S.A. requires that such a contract be authorized by resolution; and

**WHEREAS** the Borough of Harvey Cedars desires to enter into an agreement effective January 1, 2021 with the County of Ocean to provide fire inspection services for the Borough.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to enter into and execute a Shared Services Agreement with the County of Ocean for the provision of fire inspection services, in accordance with the terms of said agreement for a period of two (2) years commencing January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2022.
- 2. Said agreement may be terminated or amended for any reason by providing sixty (60) days advance written notice to the other Party.
- 3. A copy of this agreement shall be kept on file and be available for public inspection in the office of the Municipal Clerk.

RECOGNIZING THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS' PARTICIPATION IN THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM AND THE MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL

PROGRAM FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION (PPI)

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars is enrolled in the National Flood Insurance

Program (NFIP) to provide flood insurance for the residents of Harvey Cedars; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars takes part in the Community Rating System

(CRS) program that is a voluntary component of the NFIP; and

WHEREAS Harvey Cedars' Class 8 Rating currently provides for \$107,187 in flood

insurance discounts for its residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars disseminates flood hazard information that not

only is beneficial to the residents through mitigation of the hazardous effects of flooding, but is

also beneficial in maximizing credit in the CRS program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by having completing a flood insurance

assessment (FIA), in accordance with the 2017 CRS Coordinator's Manual, it has been determined

that 83.2% of the properties in Harvey Cedars, a barrier island, are insured through the National

Flood Insurance Program, and that by completing the annual Island-wide program for Public

Information update and executing that program for 2021, minutes of which are attached hereto,

this level of coverage will remain high due to the fact that insurance is mandatory for properties

that have federally backed mortgages in the special flood hazard area, and furthermore, post

"Sandy", that flood insurance is a wise investment for all property owners including year round

renters.
