The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on December 22, 2022 in the Asbury Park Press and on December 29, 2022 in the Beach Haven Times.

Mayor Oldham explained joining into the co-op purchasing agreement allows the borough to save money on a new surf rake, the surf rake is used to clean our beaches. The mayor continued by informing the public that beaches in Harvey Cedars are raked frequently in the summer months.

RESOLUTION #2023-071:

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AND THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH FOR THE PROVISION OF LEGAL SERVICES

Motion to adopt: Commissioner Rice Second: Commissioner Imperiale

Mayor Oldham stated that all of the island towns have agreed to join in Offshore Wind litigation with Long Beach Township. The litigation is aimed to, put a pause to the start of the Offshore Wind Project, until new and updated research is done. Current research and studies, which indicate "no impact", are outdated with inaccurate data as specs having been modified over time.

Questions from the audience were asked regarding; the purpose of the lawsuit, costs associated for Harvey Cedars, past research and when the last research was done, and information regarding other offshore projects along other New Jersey coastlines.

Commissioner Rice and Mayor Oldham stated that unity and support for this lawsuit, with all of the other island towns was important. Commissioner Imperiale noted his initial opposition to joining in the lawsuit, however he also believes in the importance of unity and has decided to supports Commissioner Rice and Mayor Oldham. Commissioner Imperiale will support the litigation efforts.

A lengthy discussion between the residents present and the three Commissioners took place regarding outdated 2012 data being used to move forward on the Offshore Wind Project. The Commissioners explained that our role in joining in litigation is aimed at getting the State to do a new study, using current data including current property valuations and proposed windmill heights, which are much larger than originally proposed in the 2012 study. Ultimately, it is the Commissioner's belief that it is important to stand together with the other towns on matters like this one, to show island unity.

Kathy Ries, Tax Payers Association member, stated that the Joint Taxpayers Association organization is planning to have informational sessions on Offshore Wind, as a means to educate the public. Dates have not been set.

RESOLUTION #2023-072 BILLS:

Public Property Usage Requests:

- 1. A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice to approve a small wedding ceremony between 80th & 81st Street beach to Kevin Boyle of Ship Bottom. The applicant requests the use of 80th Street beach for his wedding ceremony on September 22, 2023, between the hours of 3pm-6pm. Rental furniture will be used and includes benches and a trellis. Approximately 40 people are expected.
- 2. Motion was made by Commissioner Rice, seconded by Commissioner Imperiale to approve a fundraising wiffle/softball game to ALO (Alliance for Living Ocean) Foundation on July 22nd or August 5, 2023, between the hours of 6pm to 8pm at the auxiliary field in Harvey Cedars Park. 40 people are expected. Bases will be supplied by ALO. The Clerk will confirm with ALO to see which date is preferred.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Walt Naisby, 82nd Street asked questions relating to, how the position for Mayor is determined in Harvey Cedars currently, and how it will be determined for the upcoming Municipal Election in November. Commissioner Imperiale stated ordinances would need to be changed if the process, currently where the three commissioners choose a mayor by way of a vote, was to be changed. A discussion took place about the need for a referendum if the form of government in Harvey Cedars was to be changed.

Fred Schragger, E Salem Ave. resident and retired attorney stated that he could look into the legal requirements, he believed a referendum would be required to change the form of government.

Commissioner Imperiale stated his feeling, that the person with the most votes should be Mayor. A discussion continued regarding different forms of government and the upcoming November Municipal election.

Mr. Walt Naisby changed the topic to questions regarding beach profiles on 82nd Street. Mr. Naisby stated his concerns about accessibility to the beach. Mayor Oldham said, he will look at the beach and work on making sure the slope makes sense, and that the beach remains accessible.

Stephen Cole of Bay Terrace Ave., and Joe Gieger of 77th Street, along with other residents present brought back the topic of how a mayor should be chosen in the upcoming elections.

Questions regarding the procedure and form of government were raised by Mr. Gieger and Mr. Cole.

An update on the Streetscape Project was given by Mayor Oldham. Mayor Oldham reported that we are looking to go out to bid soon. We're currently working on phase 2 funding. Other updates from the Mayor included; the Department of Transportation bridge work, the State will finally go on a temporary hiatus towards the end of the month, after a very painful traffic month. Mayor Oldham also discussed the possibility of joining in with Long Beach Township when we go out to bid for a new trash contract to see if we can get better rates.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, based upon the foregoing Recitals, which are incorporated herein and made material terms of this Agreement by reference, and in consideration of the mutual promises and representations set forth herein, the Township and Borough hereby and expressly agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Lead Agency</u>. The Township shall be designated the lead agency for the Legal Services and has and shall continue to coordinate the Legal Services by and through its elected officials, employees, and attorney on a day-to-day basis. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Pashman Stein shall be the designated legal counsel for the Borough for the Legal Services pursuant to and in accordance with the Rules of Professional Conduct.
- 2. Retention of Pashman Stein. The Borough agrees to and does retain the legal services of Pashman Stein pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the Engagement Letter, which is incorporated herein and made material terms of this Agreement by reference, and this Agreement, and the Borough shall adopt a resolution authorizing this Agreement and a Resolution setting forth the retention of Pashman Stein pursuant to and in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law and the State Pay-to-Play Law.
- 3. <u>Fees and Consideration</u>. The Township shall pay and be responsible for the payment of the legal fees and costs pursuant to the Engagement Letter and the Borough shall be responsible for payment and contribution of \$10,000.00 to the Township for the Legal Services on or before January 31, 2024.
