#### HARVEY CEDARS, NJ

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:30pm. Commissioners Imperiale and Rice and Board Attorney Michael McKenna were present.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor stated to the best of his knowledge all the requirements of the Sunshine Law have been met. Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on December 9, 2021 in the Asbury Park Press and on December 16, 2021 in the Beach Haven Times, and republished with amendments on February 24, 2022 and March 8, 2022 respectively.

**Motion** to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on September 2, 2022 was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice.

The Mayor read the following ordinance by title and number and asked for a motion to introduce.

A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Karl Pfeil for a block party on Bay Terrace for the neighborhood on Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup> from 3pm to 10pm. 60 to 80 people, band, no street blockage.

### 3. Wedding Ceremony – 77<sup>th</sup> Street Beach

A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Jessica Kunze and Doug Ballinger for a wedding ceremony on the 77<sup>th</sup> Street beach on Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. Approx. 50-60 people.

#### 4. 2023 Lacrosse & Soccer Camps – Sunset Park

After a discussion of prior year background check requirement issues, a unanimous motion was made to table both camp requests pending a determination of a new background check process for camp vendors.

#### PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz, W. 82<sup>nd</sup> Street, asked for a status on the construction start time. The Mayor stated the Board will come up with a consensus for a change. A discussion was held regarding managing construction sites, builders, timing of construction projects, daylight working hours in the winter, and the enforcement of the changes. Public input was made by Fred Schragger, E. Salem, Steve Cole, Bay Terrace, Jim Fritz, Peter and Angela Lisciotto, Warwick Ave., in favor of changing the start time to be 8am year-round.

The Mayor asked Mr. Cole if the fish were cleaned up on the boat ramp (Kinsey Cove). A discussion was held regarding the recent fish kill in Harvest and Kinsey Coves.

Kathy Ries, Taxpayers Association, stated dune grass will be available October 7<sup>th</sup>, and the Association will be planning a "dune grass planting social". She stated 62 bricks are on order, and the net profit at this time is \$5,177. Fred Schragger asked how many are needed before construction can start; the Mayor responded typically 70% of funding is needed prior to project start.

Mayor Oldham stated the LBI School Board meeting tomorrow night at 7pm will have a contract to be voted on for the sale of the Ship Bottom school. Fred Schragger, Harvey Cedars' representative on the LBI School Board, said the \$14million contract with the contractor Pagnotta has contingencies that he has not yet seen. Mr. Schragger suggested members of the public should attend to question the contract and contingencies; he said the 1.5-year-old litigation matter is still pending. A discussion continued regarding the lawsuit, the contract, and how the sale could proceed with cost, zoning and planning. Mr. Schragger stated he is in favor of the sale, however he needs to see the contingencies and details.

Commissioner Imperiale reminded the public the next Police Community Forum will be held a week from Wednesday on the 28th.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2022-18

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, AMENDING ORDINANCE 2017-05 OF THE BOROUGH FINALLY ADOPTED ON FEBRUARY 21, 2017, PROVIDING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A WELL AND RELATED IMPROVEMENTS, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,825,000 THEREFORE, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,825,000 IN BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS TO FINANCE THE SAME

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), DOES ORDAIN, AS FOLLOWS:

Bond Ordinance No. 2017-05 of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, finally adopted on February 21, 2017 (the "Prior Ordinance"), is hereby further amended in full to read as follows:

Section 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Harvey Cedars, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough"), as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,825,000 (representing an increase of \$700,000 from the Prior Ordinance). No down payment is required hereunder as this ordinance involved an environmental infrastructure project to be funded by loans pursuant to the New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Financing Program.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not otherwise provided for hereunder, negotiable bonds or notes are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,825,000 (representing an increase of \$700,000 from the Prior Ordinance) pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued is the installation of a well and related water mains and the construction of a well house, and including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that, except as provided in N.J.S.A 58:11B-9(e), no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part of all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The capital budget or temporary capital budget (as applicable) of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget or amended temporary capital budget (as applicable) and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose the Borough may lawfully undertake as an improvement of a municipal public utility, and no part of the costs thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is forty (40) years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate

thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,825,000 (representing an increase of \$700,000 from the Prior Ordinance), and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that law.

- (d) An amount not exceeding \$365,000 (representing an increase of \$80,000 from the Prior Ordinance) for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.
- (e) The Borough reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvement described in Section 3 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the Borough further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof.

Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough is hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. This Ordinance amends Bond Ordinance 2017-05 of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey, finally adopted on February 21, 2017. To the extent that any previous ordinance or resolution is inconsistent herewith or contradictory hereto, said ordinance or resolution is hereby repealed or amended to the extent necessary to make it consistent herewith.

<u>Section 10</u>. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
