PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz, 82nd Street asked for updates on the beach replenishment. Mayor Oldham stated that the Army Corp and the Department of Protection are in talks with Fish and Wildlife

regarding where the sand is going to be pulled from for the replenishment. The Corp is expected to award a bid soon. Best-case scenario the project could start as early as this March if all goes well.

Kathy Ries, President of the Taxpayers Assassination commented on how good the Point at Sunset Park looks. Custom bricks have been inlaid into the path; the area is looking even better than anticipated stated Ries.

Fred Schragger, East Salem Ave. gave an update on the Board of Education, stating that there will be a legal hearing on December 7, 2023 concerning the proposed sale of the school. Fred also suggested that the Commissioner write a letter to the Board of Education asking for up to date information regarding all matters and to request a mold report.

TOPICS OF INTEREST –

Commissioner Imperiale again promoted "No Shave November". The Police Department is participating with David's Dream & Believe Cancer Foundation to raise money for the cause. Commissioner Imperiale stated that the police department was also collecting toys for Toys for Tots.

Commissioner Rice mentioned that holiday beach badges were available for purchase.

Mayor Oldham announced that the bid for the Well Project came in much higher than anticipated. A discussion will take place to decide how the Board will proceed. Oldham also announced that the Borough was awarded \$432,000 for phase 2 of the Streetscape project. Work will continue for the original Streetscape plan with these additional funds.

Mayor Oldham reported that the Board of Elections told him that there were enough irregularities in the municipal election to warrant a recount. Mayor Oldham stated that he thinks it makes sense to do a recount for transparency in the election process.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER XIII ENTITLED "ZONING" AS IT PERTAINS TO INSTALLATION OF POOLS

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 13-7.4 entitled "Permits" is hereby amended by supplementing the following sentence to the end of the paragraph: All pool construction and inspections must be completed within 60 days of the issuance of a pool permit.
- Section 2. Section 13-17.5 entitled "Swimming Pools." is hereby supplemented by adding paragraph f. as follows:
 - f. *Dewatering*. No dewatering shall be permitted between the Friday before Memorial Day and Labor Day of any calendar year. All dewatering for swimming pools, including excavation and seasonal draining, shall be completed within 15 days from the start of the pumping.

Groundwater pumped to the surface either during construction or for any other maintenance requirements must be directed via flex pipe with a silt bag/filter (properly maintained) into the nearest storm drain or into the bay or lagoon if the pool location is along the bay or lagoon. No dirt, silt, sand or runoff debris of any kind shall be permitted or caused to accumulate on a public street or any body of water. No rubbish, debris or litter of any kind shall be permitted to remain or accumulate in or about the swimming pool during construction.

- <u>Section 3</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- <u>Section 5</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION #2023-104

ENCOURAGES OUR STATE LEGISLATORS TO PROVIDE FAIR AND EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF DISCRETIONARY SPENDING APPROPRIATIONS IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET FOR KEY PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, Ocean County's year-round population continues to grow along with the needs of its residents; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County is one of the largest counties in the state land wise with one of the largest county road networks, and is also home to the largest body of water in the state - Barnegat Bay - a national estuary; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County, which is a premier tourism destination bringing in large sums of revenue to the state of New Jersey, doesn't get the same financial help or benefits as other areas of the state, including many northern and urban cities and counties; and

WHEREAS, as an example, Ocean County once again was excluded from the state's annual "Christmas Tree" list receiving no extra state funding for projects that fall outside of the normal budget; and

WHEREAS, in the meantime, millions of dollars have been allocated to towns and counties in predominantly urban regions, without a comprehensive list of appropriations and no way to easily access information on how all the money is being spent; and

WHEREAS, media reports on the "Christmas Tree" list, a fund for legislators' pet projects and other expenses that normally fall outside the line items of the annual budget, revealed that Ocean County received zero dollars in 2023; and

WHEREAS, urban and city legislative districts received the bulk of the \$661.6 million that lawmakers earmarked for projects in individual counties or towns; and

WHEREAS, included on the list was funding for a new marina, swimming pool and a dog park in Northern New Jersey, Camden County received \$64 million for new infrastructure projects and Union County was second with \$57.5 million award; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of additional funds for Ocean County, the Route 9 corridor continues to present a traffic bottleneck, as do other state roads in the County. Additional funds could also help with the construction of a new justice complex annex to house state courts, substantial repairs to the county parking garage, to fund recreational programs, transportation services, needed assistance for our seniors and veterans, to protect Barnegat Bay and to help the 33 municipalities that make up the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of

the Borough of Harvey Cedars, County of Ocean, encourage our state legislators to provide

fair and equitable distribution of discretionary spending appropriations in the annual state

budget for key programs that will assist not just Ocean County residents but the thousands

of people from across the state that visit the County annually.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution shall be

made available to Governor Phil Murphy, Ocean County Mayors, and State Legislators.
