PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz, West 82nd Street, stated there has been a rumor going around town that Harvey Cedars is not approving any outdoor seating for restaurants, and asked if this was true or false. The Mayor said the Board has not been asked to approve any nor has any application been received. A discussion took place regarding outdoor seating and each Commissioner gave his opinion and comments:

<u>Commissioner Imperiale</u> stated the Board received letters and emails requesting that outdoor seating continue next year, most of the letters were from people in the surrounding area of the business district. He said there are several ways of making it happen, some more permanent, but the easiest way is to do a resolution to continue it next year. He said the Board will discuss the best way to approve it; in his opinion there will be outdoor seating in some form.

<u>Commissioner Rice</u> stated the supporting letters and emails received most likely stem from the fact that there's a rumor going around that it will be eliminated, but outdoor seating is a topic still being discussed. He said it is obvious everybody likes outside seating, but in his opinion, he likes it when there's a view of something and truly outside.

He said he observed the traffic from the firehouse every weekend, cars driving up and down 80th Street searching for parking and making U-turns on the apron at the firehouse. He said he agrees with the outside seating concept, but not at the expense of taking away the majority of parking spots; there has to be a happy medium.

Mayor Oldham said in his opinion, COVID seems to be sticking around and unless there's some magic cure there has to be concern for the restaurants, businesses need to continue. He said there needs to be a plan for this year that may be different for the future; there needs to be some structure, it cannot be a free-for-all. He said the fear of sitting next to people has increased the take-out business, which has added to the traffic but should subside after a while. There are some anomalies to this COVID that we are all trying to figure out.

Mayor Oldham summarized the rumor is not true, and the Borough has not turned anyone down. He said the Board will work on a plan that will be very fair.

Jim Fritz said he understood there will be outdoor seating, and the rumors are false. Mr. Fritz stated, in his opinion, taking away the parking spaces (in Black Eyes Susan parking lot) would not make a difference in the parking issue since there are only 10 to 15 spaces.

Jim Fritz stated the Harvey Cedars Taxpayers Association previously offered assistance in funding the park playground boat, but his neighbor has another suggestion that the HCTA is also willing to assist with. Walt Naisby, East 82nd Street, suggested the use of a fiberglass boat adapted for use as a playground boat; he offered to find one that may work. Mayor Oldham said it was a good idea, however safety and liability is a concern. The Mayor said Public Works found a boat built by the Amish, however the State's purchasing requirements could not be met. He said there are a lot of playground equipment parts that are on order, and there is a plan in the works to improve the park.

Mayor Oldham said the directional drilling on 84th Street to Bay Terrace has begun, this will improve the water supply to Bay Terrace; down the road the watermain will need to be replaced. He said Public Works is working on the watermain project on Holly, getting ready to pave it, 8 or 9 bids were received for the job. The Mayor said he is hoping to receive the State's infrastructure money for the well at Borough Hall, unfortunately you almost have to go out to bid before you know if you will get the grant.

The Mayor asked Jim Fritz, Vice-President of HCTA, if he could discuss the beach with the Trustees. Mr. Fritz said the next meeting is January 14th usually at 10am, it may be via Zoom, and he will confirm by email.

The Board announced the Fire Company will be escorting Santa tonight, and wished all a Merry Christmas.

- 3. This Resolution shall be known and may be cited as the Cooperative Pricing Resolution of the Borough of Harvey Cedars.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- 5. The fully executed agreement shall take effect upon approval of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services and shall continue in effect for a period of five (5) years unless terminated by either party as more fully defined in the agreement.
