

Due to COVID-19 and social distancing guidelines, the regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, NJ was hosted by the Municipal Clerk via Zoom in the Borough Hall meeting room with Mayor Oldham, Commissioner Imperiale and Commissioner Rice. The public was able to join the meeting via Zoom; 5 members of the public and 4 Borough employees were Zoomed-in.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Oldham at 4:35pm.

The Mayor asked all to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Mayor stated to the best of his knowledge all the requirements of the Sunshine Law have been met. Pursuant to the applicable portions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. The schedule of this meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars is listed in the notice of meetings posted on the bulletin board located in the Borough Hall and the Borough's website and was published on December 26, 2020 in the Asbury Park Press and on December 31, 2020 in the Beach Haven Times. N.J.S.A 10:4-8(b) authorizes local units to conduct public meetings through use of streaming services and other online meeting platforms. Zoom link information for this meeting was posted on the website February 23, 2021.

Public Property Usage requests:

1. Surf Contest – Hudson Avenue Beach

Motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice, to approve the request by Randy Townsend and the NSSA to hold a small surfing competition at the Hudson beach for a 1-day event on a weekend in March, wave dependent, from 8:00am to noon. 50 people expected.

2. Wedding Ceremony & Reception – Sunset Park

A discussion was held for the request by Kristen Pisaturo to use Sunset Park for a wedding ceremony & reception on Friday, September 10, 2021 (or Friday, Sept. 3) from 3:30pm to 8:30pm (or earlier); maximum of 50 people, seating, DJ & bar in gazebo (bar optional per Borough requirements), 3 food trucks, and additional picnic benches. The date was determined as September 10th; however, the request was tabled until a diagram of the layout is submitted including a closed-off area where alcohol is served.

TOPICS OF INTEREST –

Commissioner Imperiale gave an update on Boulevard crosswalks; he stated after the speed limits on the side streets were adjusted, the Police Chief and Superintendent surveyed where crosswalks could be added to the Boulevard, and requested the County for 9 new crosswalks, and 7 were approved. He said before Memorial Day, crosswalks will be painted on Cape May, Essex, 72nd, 76th, 79th, 81st, and 82nd Streets; this information will be put in the monthly email newsletter; the 2 that were not approved were Hudson and 72nd.

(Clerk's note: Correction to the crosswalk sites was submitted after the meeting: Cape May Avenue, Hudson Avenue, Essex Avenue, 76th Street, 79th Street, 81st Street, and 82nd Street were approved for crosswalks; Union and 72nd were not approved.)

Mayor Oldham said his department has been on the beach every day to repair the walkovers; they should finish up by the end of the next week; one of the tractors needed repair; the Chief and Superintendent prepared a damage assessment of the beach and are hoping to get reimbursement from the County for walkover repair and dune fencing. He said the Land Use Board subcommittees are working on developing streetscapes for sidewalks, possibly receive grant money, and also working on zoning issues in the commercial zone. He added Public Works repaired a water leak, possibly due to damage done from a pool installation; there are still a number of issues the County is aware of regarding repairs on the Boulevard such as the crosswalks, some of the drainage, storm drains and manholes.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR –

Carol Sziklay thanked the Commissioners for the monthly emails, she said it keeps everyone up to date and it keeps their minds on the summer, she likes it. She wanted to remind the Board about the pickleball courts; she stated she felt just as strongly as she did when she spoke in the summer regarding reservations for pickleball and tennis courts. The Board stated they have discussed this matter, but have different opinions, however it has been determined there will not be a mandate for reservations. A discussion continued on the usage fee for pickleball courts, whether a beach badge is required or a separate fee be charged for the use. The Mayor thanked Ms. Sziklay and appreciated her input; he stated the Board will come up with something they believe will be the best solution, but always amendable.

Jim Fritz asked the Board to confirm the spring Meet & Greet and the town-wide yard sale. The Board agreed to both events, however COVID requirements at the time must be observed. Mr. Fritz asked if the new crosswalks were in addition to the existing crosswalks. Yes, they are.

Mike Songer asked about the proposed sidewalks and the funding. The Mayor said the sidewalks are in business district, from Borough Hall to 80th Street and grant money is being sought to fund them; he said currently when businesses come to the Land Use Board, that is the time when improvements can be made, however there have been different designs being used and the subcommittee is looking at sidewalk uniformity; if streetscapes grant money is used, the Borough will have to obtain easements. Mr. Songer requested to be kept part of the discussion since he had involvement in the Boulevard safety (four lane project).

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-06

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, OCEAN COUNTY,
NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 13 ENTITLED “ZONING”
AS IT PERTAINS TO LANDSCAPING IMPROVEMENTS IN THE RIGHT OF WAY**

WHEREAS drivers and passengers of vehicles parked on a side street may be hindered by landscaping improvements while exiting the vehicle; and

WHEREAS an existing ordinance, Section 13-15.4, prohibits improvements, i.e., landscaping, to be placed closer than five (5) feet from the edge of pavement, with the exception of mailboxes, for the intention of providing room for vehicle occupants to exit the vehicle easily; and

WHEREAS it has been observed and determined by Borough Officials that certain areas may allow for the above-mentioned improvement location as long as the improvement is not higher than twelve inches; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the Board of Commissioners to amend the exceptions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 13-15.4.c of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled “Use of Contiguous Borough Right of Way” is hereby amended by deleting in its entirety paragraph 4.

Section 2. Section 13-15.4 of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled “Use of Contiguous Borough Right of Way” is hereby amended by supplementing new paragraph d. as follows:

- d. No improvement higher than twelve inches (12”), i.e. landscaping, shall be placed closer than five (5) feet from the edge of the pavement. Permitted exceptions:
 - 1. Mailboxes
 - 2. Properties along easements
 - 3. Streets at least fifty feet (50’) in width on the west side of Long Beach Blvd.
 - 4. Designated No Parking streets at least fifty feet (50’) in width on the east side of Long Beach Blvd.

Section 3. This Ordinance repeals any inconsistent ordinance or ordinances or part or parts thereof.

Section 4. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Borough Mayor and Commissioners hereby declare that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION #2021-024

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, COUNTY OF OCEAN,
STATE OF NEW JERSEY, REQUESTING PUBLIC COMMENT OPPORTUNITIES
FOR LONG BEACH ISLAND COMMUNITIES REGARDING THE ATLANTIC
SHORES WIND PROJECT**

WHEREAS on 31 January 2018, New Jersey Governor, the Honorable Phil Murphy, issued Executive Order #8 promoting Offshore Wind Energy, and on May 23, 2018 issued Executive Order #28 signing a measure to advance New Jersey's Clean Energy Economy; and

WHEREAS in September 2020 the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, as guided by the pertinent executive orders of Governor Murphy, published the New Jersey Offshore Wind Strategic Plan noting that the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) lease area OCS-A 0499, located 10 to 20 miles offshore from Atlantic City to Barnegat Light encompassing approximately 183,000 acres is leased to Atlantic Shores Offshore Wind, hereafter Atlantic Shores (a joint venture between EDF Renewables and Shell), which in October 2020 released a project update; and

WHEREAS in early 2021 Atlantic Shores will submit to BOEM a Construction and Operations Plan (COP) for consideration and COP approval by BOEM to begin construction/operations of an extensive offshore wind farm with onshore construction commencing in 2023; and

WHEREAS Atlantic Shores project has raised questions and concerns among the people of the Borough of Harvey Cedars and other Long Beach Island communities regarding the direct impact upon Long Beach Island, including but not limited to, the economic impact on commercial and recreational fishing and recreational boating; the economic impact on tourism; degradation of pristine views of an uncluttered ocean environment; safety issues relative to all classes of boating; safety of onshore transmission infrastructure; and a cost benefits analysis of the direct economic benefit to Long Beach Island; and

WHEREAS the questions and concerns raised in regards to the Atlantic Shores project have been raised in other Atlantic Coast offshore wind projects in:

- North Carolina (Matt Shipman, "Study: Near-Shore Wind Farms Would Have Big Impact on Coastal Tourism" | NC State News (ncsu.edu)),
- Nantucket, Massachusetts (Wind power Engineering and Development, Lessons learned from Cape Wind (windpowerengineering.com)) and
- Block Island, Rhode Island, (Recharge News, "America's First offshore Wind Farm Faces Shutdown After Cables 'not buried deep enough'" (rechargenews.com)); and

WHEREAS the Atlantic shores project will have a direct effect on the life and well-being of the people of the Borough of Harvey Cedars and Long Beach Island, and the opportunity to provide substantive comments, ask questions, and provide input to date has been minimal and inadequate on the part of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and Atlantic Shores; and

WHEREAS as Atlantic Shores is submitting the project COP and beginning the two-year BOEM process of review, this provides an opportunity for substantial public participation in the project review.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars finds and declares their opposition to the Atlantic Shores Wind Project being submitted to the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM), and respectfully requests that the BOEM initiate a constructive public comment opportunity for the communities of Long Beach Island that runs concurrent to, and as an integral aspect of, the review process of Atlantic Shores' Construction and Operations Plan (COP) submission and likewise that the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities and Atlantic Shores engage the people of Long Beach Island in constructive dialogue regarding the concerns, questions and ideas regarding the project.
