Karen Gieger – 6 E. 77th Street - shared that she believes that the speed reader coming into Harvey Cedars should be moved so cars are forced to slow down sooner.

Karen Robbins – Neptune Market – questioned if it would be possible to ticket individuals that are seen on surveillance performing a U-turn? The Commissioners shared that it is not legal.

Susan Ryan – requested some information on the status of the flood mitigation. Commissioner Gieger shared that valves have started to be installed.

Linda Kragie – questioned the timeline of the revaluation. Commissioner Rice explained that the revaluation should be wrapping up for the 2026 tax year.

Marilyn Upton – 5 E. 81st Street – asked if a sign could be placed by Neptune Market to not reverse onto Long Beach Boulevard. Mayor Imperiale shared that cars will not be able to park in the front any longer after Neptune places picnic tables in that area.

Kathy Ries – 29 Cedars Avenue – questioned Resolution 2025-035. She requested some further information on where the notices would be posted. Acting Municipal Clerk Lisiewski shared that notices would be posted on the borough's website. The resolution is being passed to show support for the change due to the lack of physical newspapers in the modern age.

SUPPORT PUBLISHING LEGAL NOTICES ON OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT WEBSITES

WHEREAS, the sunset provision of March 1, 2025, imposed under P.L. 2024 c.106 is fast approaching in what was a temporary solution that allowed local governments to comply with the public notice requirements under the law in time for annual reorganization meetings in January; and,

WHEREAS, local government officials serve as the stewards of property taxpayer dollars and should no longer be required to subsidize the newspaper industry with revenues collected from publishing legal notices in the press; and,

WHEREAS, long before NJ Advanced Media's announcement that it was terminating daily print publications in January of 2025, local government officials found it increasingly difficult to comply with the public notice requirements under the law as the media has become almost exclusively digitized and struggled to retain staff, resources, and publications; and,

WHEREAS, legislation that will authorize local governments to publish legal notices on a local government's official website will streamline an antiquated and overly burdensome process and save valuable time, resources, and property taxpayer dollars; and,


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough of Harvey Cedars does in fact, hereby urge state leaders to pass legislation that will authorize municipalities, counties, school districts, and all local governments to publish legal notices in a clear, transparent, and timely manner on a local government's official website.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be sent to Governor Phil Murphy, Senate President Nicholas Scutari, Speaker of the General Assembly Craig Coughlin, Senator Carmen Amato, Assemblyman Brian E. Rumpf, Assemblyman Gregory E. Myhre, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS,
COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING A SHARED
SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM FOR THE
USE OF OFF-DUTY OFFICERS FOR A PUBLIC PROJECT**

WHEREAS pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq., the Borough of Harvey Cedars is authorized to enter into an agreement with any other municipality to provide or receive any service that each local unit participating in the agreement is empowered to provide or receive within its own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS there is an ongoing public roadway project in the Borough of Harvey Cedars which requires the employment of off-duty police officers for off-duty police related services pursuant to the terms of the project's contract; and

WHEREAS the scope of the required employment of off-duty officers exceeds the manpower of the Borough of Harvey Cedars' Police Department; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Harvey Cedars desires assistance from the Borough of Ship Bottom Police Departments for employment of off-duty police officers; and

WHEREAS the Borough of Ship Bottom has agreed to allow its police officers to perform off-duty employment related to the Public Roadway Project in the Borough of Harvey Cedars.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars hereby agrees to enter into a shared services agreement related to the Public Roadway Projects with the Borough of Ship Bottom, and agrees to the following material terms:

1. Ship Bottom police officers shall be authorized to perform the required services related to the Public Roadway Project in the Borough of Harvey Cedars;
2. The Borough of Harvey Cedars shall serve as the lead agency and contract with the contractor for the required services;
3. Ship Bottom shall provide Harvey Cedars the name of the officer(s) when scheduled for duty;
4. Said availability of Ship Bottoms officers shall be without detriment to the Ship Bottom Police Department schedule or to the citizens of the Borough of Ship Bottom;
5. Any party may terminate the agreement at any time during the term of the agreement with thirty (30) days written notice;
6. The terms of the Borough of Harvey Cedars' Code Section 2-5.2.j, attached hereto, shall govern and the compensation for the off-duty officers shall be paid by the Borough of Harvey Cedars to the Borough of Ship Bottom for the services provided by the off-duty officers;
7. Pursuant to Harvey Cedars' off-duty rates, compensation shall be a total of \$100 per hour with \$20 for administrative and \$80 for officer pay;
8. The Borough of Harvey Cedars shall remit payment to the Borough of Ship Bottom for any work performed by Ship Bottom officers on a bi-weekly basis;
9. All off-duty officers shall remain employees of the respective parties, and shall use their respective equipment;
10. Each party shall be responsible for the continued insurance coverage relating to the services provided by their respective police officers, which shall be in addition to the insurance required to be provided by the contractor;
11. The term of this agreement shall be four (4) years.





RESOLUTION #2025-042

ESTABLISHING THE COURT RULES FOR THE HARVEY CEDARS PICKLEBALL COURTS, TENNIS COURTS, AND BOCCEE BALL COURTS

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 4-8 of the Borough Code, the governing body is authorized to annually adopt by resolution rules and regulations for the Harvey Cedars Sunset Park courts.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars that the following rules shall apply for all recreation courts located in Sunset Park, Harvey Cedars:

PICKLEBALL RULES OF PLAY

1. Hours of Play – Pickleball courts are open for play from 8:00AM to 8:00PM daily.
2. Recreation Pass – Every player must possess a valid Recreation Pass to play.
3. Season – Saturday of Father's Day weekend through Labor Day.
4. Open Play – All courts shall be Open Play (Player Waiting Rule) from 8:00AM to 1:00PM daily.
5. Player Waiting – When players are waiting to play, they indicate they want to play in a manner agreed upon, such as placing their paddle in a rack or container or verbally. At the end of a game, after the good sportsmanship greeting at the nets, players who just played shall look to see if anyone is waiting to play before starting another game.
6. If someone is waiting to play the following occurs:
 - a. 1 player waiting to play – a person from the losing team leaves and player waiting to play comes onto the court to play next.
 - b. 2 or more players waiting to play – the losing team vacates the court and two players waiting come onto the court to play next.
7. Reservations – Reserved 2-weeks in advance.
 - a. The north pickleball court can be reserved from 1:00PM to 8:00PM.
 - b. 2-hour maximum for each reservation.
 - c. \$25.00 reservation fee.
 - d. All players in reservation group must possess a valid Recreation Pass.
 - e. Reservation Refunds – Payment can be transferred to another date. **No refunds.**
8. If the court is not reserved, then it is Open Play Rule.
9. No glass bottles, dogs, and loud foul language on the courts.

TENNIS RULES OF PLAY

1. Hours of Play – Tennis courts are open for play from 8:00AM to 8:00PM daily.
2. Recreation Pass – Every player must possess a valid Recreation Pass to play.
3. Season – Saturday of Father's Day weekend through Labor Day.
4. Reservations are not required.
5. Reservations – Tennis courts can be reserved 2-weeks in advance for any time. \$10 per court per hour.
6. No glass bottles, dogs, and loud foul language on the courts.
7. Reservation Refunds – Payment can be transferred to another date. **No refunds.**

BOCCEE RULES OF PLAY

1. Hours of Play – Bocce courts are open for play from 8:00AM to 8:00PM daily.
2. Recreation Pass – Every player must possess a valid Recreation Pass to play.
3. Season – Saturday of Father's Day weekend through Labor Day
4. Reservations are not required.
5. Reservations – Bocce courts can be reserved 2-weeks in advance for any time.
6. No glass bottles, dogs, and loud foul language on the courts.
7. Reservation Refunds – Payment can be transferred to another date. **No refunds.**
