Police Chief Robert Burnaford acknowledged and thanked the Commissioners for their support of the Police Department. The Chief explained the application process for a new officer, and provided a brief background of Officer MacCorkle. The Oath of Office was administered with Officer MacCorkle's parents present; his badge was pinned on him by his girlfriend. The Board congratulated and welcomed Officer MacCorkle.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR -

Jim Fritz, West 82nd Street, asked about the hair salon's ability to have Yoga sessions year-round. The Mayor explained the Land Use Board process for change of use of a business, and the new Committee formed for off-season changes.

Bob Smith, West Lee Ave., stated there is an old 1905 house built by Isaac Lee on East Lee that is for sale, and asked if the Borough could save it by moving it to either Sunset Park or the Sister's property; he said he would hate to see Harvey Cedars lose this history. A brief discussion amongst the public was held regarding the house. Susan Kramer, West 80th Street, stated she is the realtor for the property and the address is 10 East Lee Ave. The Board said they will take a look at it.

Commissioner Imperiale announced there will be monthly Police Forums, the first one will be April 27th with Chief Burnaford presenting an overview of the Department and the day-to-day operations.

POLICE DEPARTMENT AWARD PRESENTATIONS -

Chief Burnaford acknowledged and thanked all who were present: the Department's officers, Borough employees including the new Administrative Assistant for the Police Department, and past Police Chiefs Jerry Falkowski and Thomas Preiser.

The Chief gave a brief background of the annual awards, and presented the following awards:

- Ocean County Pistol Match Awards: Sgt. Steve Frazee received 2nd place for Sharp Shooter and 1st place in the Rifle Fun Match; Officers Nick D'Andrea and Dan Grundtisch were in the top 25 for Distinguished Expert Shot; Sgt. Frazee and Officer Grundtisch took 4th place in the 2-Person Team Competition.
- Certificate of Merit Presented to Officer Ben Mrozinski who over the past year has shown his eagerness to grow professionally through his high level of productivity and exemplary work ethic, particularly after being assigned additional responsibilities. As a young officer, he has continued to demonstrate self-confidence, authority and enthusiasm of that of a true leader.
- Certificate of Life Saving Award Presented to Sergeant Steve Frazee. Sgt. Frazee is a clear example and reminder that police officers are never "off duty". On May 11th at approximately 10am, Sgt. Frazee was driving to work when he observed a man being thrown approximately 1 block on his bicycle after being struck by a box truck. Sgt. Frazee immediately put his vehicle in park, jumped out and called for additional police units, first aid, paramedics and a helicopter due to the nature of his injuries. While he waited for additional resources, Sgt. Frazee was able to remove the entangled bike from the victim's body and adjusted him to allow him to breath better. Because of his quick and professional actions, the victim, Jim Fritz, is here today and in great shape because of Sgt. Steve Frazee.
- Officer of the Year This year's Officer of the Year award recipient is always in tune with what is going on with the officers, both personally and professionally, because the health and well-being of our personnel is of the upmost important to us. He remains current with new law enforcement laws and directives and is constantly a step ahead to ensure that the department is moving in the right direction. This Officer, although a Sergeant, operates at a higher level. Not only does he take care of his

assigned duties in a timely fashion, he takes the extra step to learn how and why we are doing them. His current responsibilities within the Department include but are not limited to Court Officer, Records Custodian, OPRA requests, BWC redactions, expungements, Professional Standards, UCR, Domestic Violence Liaison, scheduling, Megan's Law, Alternate Evidence Custodian, Assistant Accreditation Manager, Public Information Officer, and this awards ceremony. He comes to work every day ready to work and ready to solve the "Problem of the Day", and he is not afraid to take on difficult and unpopular assignments. He has gained the trust and respect of everyone in this department, including myself through his hard work, dedication and commitment. This Department and town are fortunate to have him as not only an officer but a supervisor. The Officer of the Year recipient is Sergeant Kevin Snow.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 13 ENTITLED "ZONING" AS IT PERTAINS TO POOL FEATURES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, as follows:

Section 1. Section 13-17.5 of the Code of the Borough of Harvey Cedars entitled "Swimming Pools.", paragraph c. entitled "Locations" is hereby repealed in its entirety and readopted as follows:

c. Locations. Swimming pools no higher than twelve (12) inches from grade shall not be any closer than ten (10) feet from any side yard, and shall not be any closer than five (5) feet from the rear property line and shall not be any closer than ten (10) feet from the bulkhead line from Barnegat Bay, lagoons, coves, and other bodies of water. There shall be a minimum distance of eight (8) feet between a pool and a primary structure. Minimum distance of five (5) feet is required between a primary structure and an accessory structure. Accessory pool features such as benches, firepits, pool waterfall features, and alike shall only be permitted within a side yard setback of a pool as long as such features are no more than twenty-four (24) inches in overall height and not exceeding a width of twenty-four (24) inches. Pool features' side yard setback shall be a minimum of eight (8) feet.

Swimming pools shall be prohibited between a primary structure and any street or easement provided that the section is used as the main access point to the property. Where a pool placement is permitted into a required front yard, the setback shall be the same as it would be for a side yard.

- <u>Section 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions.
- Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

through March 31, 2023 and shall receive absolute appointment upon satisfactory

completion of said probationary period.
