Public Property Usage requests:

1. A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice to approve previously tabled request by Scripture Union to hold their SuperKids program on Passaic beach from August 7th – 11th, 2023. Scripture Union requests to run the program Monday thru Friday from 6:30pm to 8pm, after busy beach hours. 50 participants are expected for various activities (children and their parents), no swimming will be permitted. Program has a long-standing tradition on the island since 1959, with events previously held in Surf City and Ship Bottom.
2. A motion was made by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice to approve a date change request for an event previously approved at the May 5th meeting. The date change from June 3rd to June 17th for the use of the gazebo in Sunset Park, to The Harvey Cedars Taxpayers Association for their annual “Social” in Sunset Park on Saturday, 4:00pm-6:00pm is being requested due to weather concerns.
3. A motion was conditionally approved by Commissioner Imperiale, seconded by Commissioner Rice to Brook Petagno of Pennsylvania, who is requesting to hold a small wedding ceremony on 80th Street Beach, July 8, 2023 between the hours of 3pm-6pm. Rental furniture would be used and consists of 40 or so chairs and a trellis. The ceremony would start at 5pm, and conclude at 6pm. Reception dinner to follow at Black Eyed Susan’s. POLICE DEPARTMENT AWARD PRESENTATIONS –

Chief Burnaford acknowledged and thanked all who were present.

The Chief gave a brief background of the annual awards, and presented the following awards:

Certificate of Appreciation: Presented to DPW Superintendent Bill Montag, in gratitude for countless times and hours DPW operations helped the Police Department and the Borough. Much of the work that is done takes place during overtime, holidays and weekends to make sure that our beaches and roads are maintained. Chief Burnaford stated “You are only as good as those you work with” and thanked Bill for the hard work and dedication of the DPW Department. Chief Burnaford further stated “We are thankful for the great relationship that we have with our DPW”.

Certificate of Appreciation: Presented to HCPD Chaplain Wes Smith. Chief Burnaford gave a brief history of chaplaincy and the department. Wesley Smith was recognized as a valued member of the Police Department. The Chief thanked Chaplain Smith for always being there on several occasions over the past few years when the department needed his services.

Certificate of Merit: Ocean County Police Pistol Match Awards are presented to officers for their marksmanship abilities. Chief Burnaford stated that HCPD prides themselves as having some of the best marksmen. Awards earned by the department include:

Certificate of Life Saving Award – Presented to Sergeant Steve Frazee for his quick actions taken on August 3rd of 2022 in Sunset Park during a concert when police were notified that a 14-month-old was not breathing. Sgt. Frazee immediately rendered first aid by performing rescue breaths. As a result of his quick reaction, the baby started to breathe on its own again and was ultimately transported to the EJ School where she was medevacked to a trauma center. After spending a little over two weeks at the trauma center, the baby was released back home to her parents to make a full recovery. Because of his quick and professional actions on this day, Sgt. Steve Frazee was awarded the Certificate of Life Saving Award.

Officer of the Year – Presented to Officer Daniel Grundtisch, who Chief Burnaford describes as an all-around outstanding officer who represents the Harvey Cedars Department extremely well both on duty and off duty. Chief Burnaford stated the following about Officer Grundtisch;

They are role models for everyone to follow.

This year’s Officer of the Year award Recipient is extremely detail oriented and someone you can count on to get the job done thoroughly.

On a regular basis he reviews our policies and procedures, local ordinances and NJ case law, which then typically results in constructive conversation with the supervisors on how to carry out those directives to the best of our ability and to offer suggestions and ideas on how we can make improvements.

His current responsibilities within the Department include but are not limited to; firearms instruction, vehicle maintenance coordinator, uniform coordinator, body worn camera

coordinator and new vehicle builds coordinator.

In 2021, This Officer saw the implementation of our Body Worn Camera Program and, like most technology, assisted officers and the department in working through various technological hiccups so that our body cams worked as flawlessly as possible. Now, having implemented the state mandated body worn cameras, it was incumbent on us to have our in-car camera technology integrated with the body cams. In 2022, this officer was responsible for the implementation of 4 new in-car cameras that fully integrates now with the body cams.

In addition to the cameras, a goal of this officer is to have every vehicle look and feel the same. The lights work the same, the radio works the same, the gun locks work the same etc. And as we acquire new vehicles (which vehicles are our mobile offices), this officer ensures that they all operate the same. Its best practice and sets our officers up for success.

While having many other duties and responsibilities, this Officer has earned the trust and respect of everyone in this department, including myself through his hard work, dedication and commitment.

This officer continues to be an example for all others to follow. He lives up to the department's motto: of "Commitment to Excellence".

The Board congratulated and thanked all award recipients.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR –

Joe Gieger, East 77th Street requested one last committee meeting for a Streetscape plan review. Mayor Oldham gave a quick update on the current status of the applications.

Fred Schragger, East Salem Ave. will keep everyone up to date with any news of the impending litigation for the School Board as he hears updates. Fred also gave handouts and updates on new measures to get the word out for the brick campaign, including new signs made up for the park.

Linda Kragie, West 75th Street asked for a timeline of completing roadwork on 75th street. Bill Montag, Superintendent explained the steps that would be taken to complete the project. It should be completed in approximately two weeks.

Mayor Oldham acknowledged Bill Montag and the rest of the DPW Department for all of their hard work. The team has worked very hard to prepare for the summer season. Mayor Oldham stated a lot of the work is never seen, but should be recognized. The team works very hard to make Harvey Cedars great, stated Mayor Oldham.

Commissioner Imperiale also thanked Bill and the entire DPW Department for their dedication. They are always responsive and happy to complete any task asked of them stated Commissioner Imperiale.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, 1975, ENTITLED “SEWER AND WATER” AS IT PERTAINS TO CUT & CAP FEES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEY CEDARS, as follows:

Section 1. Section 7-2.4 entitled “Water Rate Schedule”, paragraph B entitled “Service Charges”, is hereby amended and renumbered by supplementing the following:

4. A service charge of fifty dollars (\$50.00) shall be applied to any Cut and Cap, or disconnection of water service prior to demolition, or for any other purpose. The water connection will be locked by the Department of Public Works until a reconnect is requested. Reconnects will be done at no additional charge.
5. Requests for bulk water purchase from the Borough for commercial or other reasons shall be billed a flat service fee of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) plus the water charge based on gallons used per the rate schedule in paragraph A of this section. Bulk purchases are prohibited in the months of June, July and August.

Section 2. Section 7-2.4 is hereby amended by deleting the following:

- c. During the year 2009, a flat rate of one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars per quarter for two (2) consecutive quarters shall be charged to each property meter, which shall represent the base flat rate for water usage for the period of January 1, 2009 through May 30, 2009. Said quarterly rate shall be billed and due with regular quarterly bills.

Section 3. Section 7-5.4 is hereby amended by deleting the following:

- c. During the year 2009, a flat rate of sixty dollars (\$60.00) per quarter for two (2) consecutive quarters shall be charged to each property water meter, which shall represent the base flat rate for sewer rental for the period of January 1, 2009 through May 30, 2009. Said quarterly rate shall be billed and due with regular quarterly bills.

Section 4. All of the provisions of Chapter 7 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, 1975, not inconsistent herewith, are reaffirmed and readopted as if more fully set forth herein, and any provisions of said Ordinance which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. If any provision, section, subsection, or paragraph of this ordinance shall be declared to be unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative, in whole or in part, by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such provision, section, subsection, or paragraph shall, to the extent that it is not unconstitutional, invalid or inoperative, remain in full force and effect, and no such determination shall be deemed to invalidate the remaining provisions, subsections, or paragraphs of this ordinance.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption after publication in accordance with law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Borough of Harvey Cedars, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Ocean Mental Health Services, Inc., T/A Bright Harbor Healthcare having its principal office located at 687 Route 9, Bayville, NJ 08721 (BRC Address: 160 Route 9, Bayville, NJ 08721), is hereby awarded contract to provide access to social work referrals and improve access to health and integrated care programs in conjunction with The Borough of Harvey Cedars, at no cost to the Borough.
2. The Contract shall be an open-ended contract with funds being encumbered contingent upon the availability of funds in the budget year. The Borough of Harvey Cedars is only obligated under this contract to purchase printed financial and license materials from the Contractor on an as-needed basis and each order is subject to the availability to funds. This contract does not impose upon The Borough of Harvey Cedars any obligation to purchase a specific quantity of printed financial and license materials.
3. Ocean Mental Health Services, Inc., T/A Bright Harbor Healthcare shall maintain all documentation related to products, transactions or services under this contract for a period of five years from the date of final payment. Such records shall be made available to the New Jersey Office of the State Comptroller upon request.
